STEP 3 PAY ABPA and DISTRICT ACTIVITY FEES

1. **ABPA BOOSTER FEE:** This money pays for many necessities for the band during the season. Due by June 1.

2. AH11 DISTRICT SUMMER PARADE ACTIVITY FEE: Registration opens April 20, must be paid by May 15th. Please pay at: www.ahconnect.anoka.k12.mn.us

3. AHII DISTRICT FALL ACTIVITY FEE: This link will be unavailable until August 1, but must be paid by August 14. Please pay at: www.ahconnect.anoka.kl2.mn.us

**Links to pay the district fees will be <u>unavailable</u> until a sports physical is on file with the district.

FINANCIAL NEED/FEE WAIVER: If your family receives assistance from the school district free/reduced lunch program, you may qualify for a reduced district activity fee.

PAYMENT PLANS/SCHOLARSHIPS: Please do not let financial difficulties keep your student from participating. **ANY FAMILY** can request a payment plan or apply for a scholarship to offset costs. Each family must have fees paid or a plan on file with Mr. Hauser to participate in marching band. Please contact Mr. Hauser to discuss possibilities of alternate payment options.

VOLUNTEERING!

Many hours of volunteer time are necessary to keep the marching band program running smoothly. Volunteer hours are required of all families - your valuable time is needed and much appreciated.

\$100 of the ABPA fee will be returned at the end of the season banquet (usually in November), to the families who have fulfilled their 20 hours of volunteering.




The Minnesota State High School League requires that a **Sports Qualifying Physical Examination Clearance Form** must be on file with the high school and renewed every three years for each student involved in a sport/activity. UNIFORMS



What is worn beneath the uniform? The Anoka Band black spandex shirts ordered at registration are required to be worn beneath the uniform. Spandex serves to protect the uniform throughout the season and allows band members to change into and out of uniforms on the bus before and after performances. It also serves to maintain uniformity when the band is warming up or performing in half-dress (bibs and spandex only)

In addition, families are required to purchase **black spandex shorts** and **black knee-high socks** for all instrumentalists. Socks should be <u>snug</u> to prevent slouching when marching.

FAQs!

Are families responsible for uniform care and cleaning?

No. After uniform fittings in the summer, all washable pieces of the school-issued uniform are stored on the band trailer in garment bags labeled with the band member's name. Shakos are also stored in the trailer in labeled boxes. If uniforms become noticeably dirty, band parent volunteers will take them for cleaning. Dinkles may be worn home or stored in the back zipper pocket of the garment bags to prevent loss. Band parent volunteers distribute and collect chickens and mirrors before and after each performance.

What about Color Guard uniforms?

Color Guard uniforms are ordered each year to fit the theme of the season's field show. Measurements of each guard member will be taken in the summer. Guard uniforms are also stored on the band trailer in labeled garment bags and will be cleaned, if needed, by band parent volunteers.

What are Show Shirts and when are they worn?

These t-shirts display the season's field show theme on the front and a dated list and location of every expected band performance on the back. Extra show shirts are often purchased and worn by family members when volunteering or attending competitions. Band members wear show shirts on the way to competition performances, and for school pep fests or other activities as requested by Mr. Hauser.
